Blue Jean and the Midnight Oil

The opening title sequence features Vancouver model LaLaa Love dancing to the music of Blue Foundation, and throughout the film, the music is great, (Notable tunes include Wild Girl by Espionage, Hilbilly Love, Italillilly Helicas, Wilskey Song by Chinaski, Mra Gona Get You by Memphis Nights, and Burnin' Up by King lunior!

This is not your typical zombie flick. PEELERS is skillfully Were Walker as club owner Blue Jean, Jinding it difficult to let go of the past. In this is not your typical zombie link. PELLEN's is skillful assembled and the story, though inconsistent at time is riveting. The blood, gore, and dismemberment is muted enough to allow the characters to become interesting, and the movie is, by turns, funny, campy, poles, and a chef (Jason Asuncion) who makes Gordon Ramsay seem polite.

Kiwi actor Kirsty Peters turns in a lovely performance as the very pregnant Carla (stage name Licorice), who puts honey on everything, including pizza. If there is ever a post-apocalyptic sequel to PEELERS, Carla's kid could be part of it.

Their absence goes unnoticed for a while because the featured dancers, Elaine (Nikki Wallin), Frankie (Momona Komagata), and Tina (Victoria Gomez) hold everyone's attention.

Elaine's stripper name is "Baby". Frankie's is "Thundercunt".

One of the film's best moments involves Tina, a dancer new to the club. As she waits to go on stage, she becomes more and more apprehensive as she waitches Elaine's performance (an act that would be difficult for anyone to follow) but once on stage, she slowly regains confidence as she dances to Chillin' Trippy Me by Alex Morch, (until her act is unfortunately interrupted).

But the story centers around club owner and ex-baseball-player **Blue Jean** (Wren Walker). She was once, we are told, a pitcher specializing in Anuckleballs, although we see her throw a mean and accurate fastball, and she also demonstrates some skill with the bat. Blue Jean is selling her club to a fellow named **Chromagnum** (Al Dales) who has reasons for buying Blue Jean out that are much more involved than she has been led to believe. (The aptlynamed businessman turns out to be more e to the story than one would initially expect.)

In an interview with CYOUNGMEDIA, director Sevé Schelenz explained that PEELERS came about after his agent suggested he put "more blood and more boobs" into his next film. "I did some research," Schelenz explained, "and it turned out there were not a lot of stripper horror films and of the ones I found, they just weren't that great. So, I felt there was an untapped sub-genre of horror there. I went to [Lisa] DeVita and asked genre of horror there. I had there requests of her and they were: a strong female character(s) who kicked ass, a deft story, and some good twists.
